*(The pre-requisite classes need to be taken as soon as they are offered and in the order listed-- *NOTE*: some classes are only offered once per academic year (AY) and if you miss it when it is offered, you will have to wait until it is offered again the next year).

*CP6600- Professional Orientation (should be taken in your first term- it is a pre-requisite for other courses)

*CP6649- Theories of Counseling (should be taken as soon as possible- it is a pre-requisite for other courses)

*CP6610- Facilitation Skills (should be taken after CP6649- it is a pre-requisite for other courses)

*CP6642- Group Counseling

*PSY6669- Behavioral Pathology (this is a pre-requisite for PSY6670)

*PSY6670- Diagnosis & Treatment (must have taken PSY6669)

- *PSY6645- Evaluation & Assessment (must have taken CP6691)

(NOTE: The above classes do not need to be taken in order, unless it is a prerequisite. Most of the core-classes are offered only one time per academic year; so it is important to take them as they are offered or you will have to wait until it is offered again the next year).
